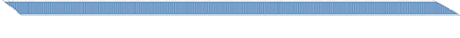

BRIGADIER GENERAL PHILLIP N. FRIETZE

UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS



Brigadier General Phillip N. Fietze is currently serving as the Commanding General, 1st Marine Logistics Group.

He hails from Las Cruces, New Mexico and is a graduate of New Mexico State University. He was commissioned through the Officer Candidate Course Program in August 1991 and attended The Basic School, the Marine Corps Engineer Officer's Course, the U.S. Army Engineer Officer's Advanced Course, Marine Corps Command and Staff College, Joint Forces Staff College, Defense



Language Institute, the Argentine Ministry of Defense War College, and is a Regional Area Officer for South America.

His service spans all elements of the Marine Air Ground Task Force, with command and staff assignments at all levels.

Command time with the Fleet Marine Forces include: Construction Platoon Commander, Marine Wing Support Squadron-374, Commanding Officer, Headquarters Company, Marine Wing Support Group-37, 1st Marine Air Wing; Inspector-Instructor, C Company, 4th Combat Engineer Battalion, 4th Marine Division; Commanding Officer, Engineer Support Company, 9th Engineer Support Battalion, 3d Force Service Support Group; Commanding Officer, 7th Engineer Support Battalion, 1st Marine Logistics Group; Commanding Officer, Headquarters Regiment, 1st Marine Logistics Group, and Commander, U.S. Marine Corps Forces Southern Command.

Staff assignments include serving as the Assistant Operations and Plans Officer, Marine Wing Support Group-37, 3d Marine Aircraft Wing; Facilities Engineers, Marine Corps Base Okinawa, Japan; Executive Officer, Combat Logistics Battalion-22, 2d Marine Logistics Group; G3 Operations Officer, 2d



Marine Logistics Group; G4 Engineer Officer, II Marine Expeditionary Force; Executive Officer, Combat Logistic Regiment-15, 1st Marine Logistics Group; Branch Head for Engineering and Explosive Ordnance Disposal, Deputy Commandant Installation and Logistics; G3 Operations Officer, 1st Marine Logistics Group, and Deputy Director, Capabilities Development Directorate, Deputy Commandant, Combat Development and Integration.

Joint assignments include Engineer Plans Officer, Joint Task Force – North, Northern Command and Civil Military Operations Officer, Combined Joint Task Force – Horn of Africa.

BGen Fietze assumed his current duties as the Commanding General of the 1st Marine Logistics Group in April 2021.



COLONEL RYAN E. SCOTT

UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS



Colonel Scott is a native of California, living in various towns within the northern county of Shasta until his enlistment in the Marine Corps in June of 1993. A graduate of the California State University, Sacramento, he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in May of 1998.

Colonel Scott's service in the operating forces include: Equipment Operator, Team Leader, and Squad Leader, Company B, 4th Landing Support Battalion (January 1994 – May 1998); Construction Section OIC and OIC Engineer Operations Division, MWSS-172 (Oct 1999-June 2002); Deputy Team Chief, Military Transition Team 6, Battalion Assistant Operations Officer, Battalion Logistics Officer, and Battalion Executive Officer, 1st Combat Engineer Battalion (August 2005-May 2008); Brigade Platoon Commander, 5th Air and Naval Gunfire Liaison Company (June 2008-June



2009); Battalion Executive Officer, 1st Combat Engineer Battalion (June 2013-July 2014); Force Engineer, I Marine Expeditionary Force (July 2014-May 2015); and Commanding Officer, 9th Engineer Support Battalion (June 2015-June 2017). Colonel Scott deployed twice to Iraq for Operation Iraqi Freedom (January 2006 – January 2007, and August 2008 – April 2009), once to Afghanistan for Operation Enduring Freedom (August 2013-December 2013), and to over 25 countries across multiple Combatant Commanders' Areas of Responsibility in support of combat operations, bi-lateral and multilateral exercises, theater security cooperation, and advising / support to operations.

Outside the operating forces, Colonel Scott's service includes: Platoon Commander and OIC, Marine Guard Forces, Marine Corps Security Force Company Kings Bay (June 2002-June 2004); Platoon Commander, Company C, OCC-189, Officers Candidate School (June – August 2005); Lead Contingency Plans Officer and Deputy Chief of Plans, US MARCENT (July 2010-June 2013); Senior Marine and Administrative Aide to the Secretary of the Navy (July 2018 – June 2020); and Deputy Director, MAGTF Staff Training Program Division (July 2020-May 2021).

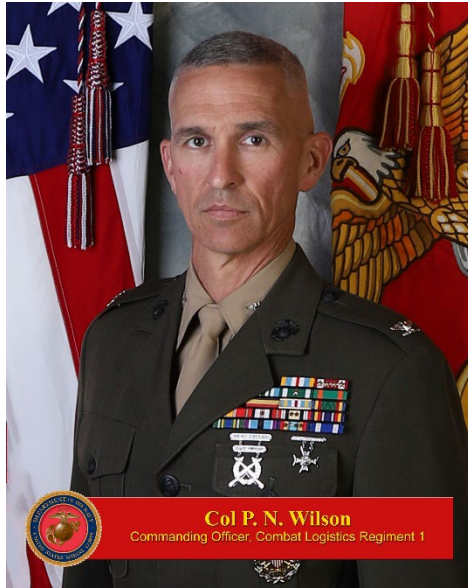

Colonel Wilson is a native of Plano, TX. He graduated from Texas A&M and was commissioned a Marine Second Lieutenant in 1998.

III MEF G-5 (August 2011 – June 2014); Plans Officer, III MEF G-35 (August 2016 – April 2017); Commanding Officer, Marine Wing Support Squadron 172 (May 2017 – May 2019); A/CS G-3, 1st Marine Logistics Group (July 2022 – January 2023).
