

## Commander's Significant Notification Events (CSNEs)



CSNE – *Information regarding activities and events identified by the commander as critical to maintaining situational awareness (visualization), facilitating timely decision-making, informing the chain of command, planning for consequence management, and providing resources and help.*



My significant notification events or things that concern me the most are those that can prevent us from accomplishing our mission, pose a threat to our battalion in terms of safety or force preservation, or that will reflect poorly on the Marine Corps. Use your best judgment.

Immediate notification, day or night, of Commanding Officer, Executive Officer and Sergeant Major in the following cases:

- Death or serious injury of a Marine, Sailor or immediate family member of CLB-13.
- Incident or indication of Hazing, Sexual Assault, or Equal Opportunity violations by or against a Marine or Sailor in CLB-13.
- A suicide attempt, indication, or ideation or self-inflicted bodily harm by any Marine or Sailor in CLB-13.
- A Marine, Sailor, or immediate family member within CLB-13 requiring unscheduled hospitalization lasting over 24 hours.
- Loss of sensitive equipment/information, COMSEC material, or OPSEC violation.
- Loss of serialized gear, weapons, ammunition, or cryptographic material.
- Reported interaction between CLB-13 Marine or Sailor and civilian/military law enforcement lasting over 24 hours.
- High profile incident or arrest involving CLB-13 Marines and Sailor that is likely to receive regional/national media attention (positive and negative) and which may bring discredit or embarrassment to the Marine Corps.
- Incidents involving Officer and SNCO misconduct.
- Vehicle accident or damage to government property.
- A change in assigned mission or alert posture by Headquarters Regiment, 1st MLG, or 13th MEU.
- Change in defense condition or force protection condition.
- Destructive weather or natural disaster event that has potential to impact CLB-13 Marines, Sailors, dependents, or facilities.
- Trigger of Battalion Commander's Critical Information Requirements (CCIRs)
- A call or visit from a Commanding Officer, General, or Flag Officer.

Battalion CCIRs will be developed per Tactical Field Evolution/Operation. Duty Officers and battalion leaders shall contact the CO or XO immediately to pass CCIR/CSNE information.
